# DRIVING DIRECTIONS FROM I-5 SOUTHBOUND OR NORTHBOUND TO SPIRIT MOUNTAIN CASINO, ABOUT 35 MILES

TAKE EXIT 253 HWY 22
TURN WEST TOWARDS SALEM. IF YOU

TURN WEST TOWARDS SALEM. IF YOU ARE EXITING FROM THE SOUTH, TURN LEFT. IF YOU ARE EXITING FROM THE NORTH, TURN RIGHT.

Go about two miles and follow the sign to Hwy 22 right turn OR-99E BUSINESS exit toward OR-22 W/Willamette Univ./City Center 0.2 mi



Turn left onto OR-22 W/OR-99E BUSINESS N/Bellevue St SE 1.2 mi



Turn right onto the OR-22 W ramp to Marion St. Br 0.1 mi



Continue onto OR-22 W/Marion St Bridge 0.2 mi



Use the left 2 lanes to turn slightly left to stay on OR-22 W



Take the ramp to Oregon Coast



Merge onto OR-18 W/OR-22 W 25.6 mi



Take the exit toward Spirit Mtn Casino

Turn right to underpass loop  $\frac{1}{2}$  Mile West of Hebo Rd. (Hwy 22)



#### **GPS GUIDE**

If you are using a GPS (Global Positioning System) to get you to the Spirit Mountain area, try entering the address, 27100 SW Salmon River Highway, Grand Ronde, OR. If that doesn't give you the results you want, try 27100 Highway 18, or enter the name, Spirit Mountain Casino.


The Latitude / Longitude Coordinates are 45.060007, -123.582178

#### **HELPFUL HINT:**

If you start relying on your GPS to guide you before you reach Interstate 5 Exit 253, you risk being routed over some narrow rural roads and/or congested city streets. It will probably get you there but we recommend that you stay on I-5 until you get near Exit 253 before engaging your GPS.



(Please make sure to use the Group ID above when making your reservation so that the club gets credit for your reservation and meets our minimum reservation quota.)

Located only 60 miles from Portland, Spirit Mountain Lodge has a variety of room types, all of which have a mini-fridge, Keurig coffeemaker, cable TV, iron, and ironing board. The Standard rooms have either two queens or one king bed. There is 24-hour front desk service and free parking and free Wi Fi.

The Spirit Mountain Lodge also has a number of dining options onsite: Amore, which serves Italian food in a casual, relaxed atmosphere: Summit View Lounge, which has a hopping lounge and sleek dining area; Mountain View Sports Bar; and Rock Creek Court Deli, serving food, mixed drinks, and beer from the heart of the casino. Plus, there is a cafe serving coffee and tea onsite.

And of course – let's not forget that for entertainment (between checking out all the Studebakers at the event) there is a casino onsite, which is the largest non-smoking casino in the state. The casino has table games, such as exhilarating blackjack, tempting roulette, and the laid-back game of Pai Gow, as well as slot machines and Keno. Plus, if you love sports, there is online sports betting through an app that can be downloaded from Spirit Mountain's website and then enjoyed on the big screen TVs at the lodge's sports bar.







#### **RV PARKING**

There is an RV parking area at Spirit Mountain Casino. It is on the East side of the complex, behind the Service Station.

As you are taking the entrance loop, a sign will direct you to the left to access the RV parking area.

This is a "dry camp". It is a large paved area, but with no hook-ups for electricity, water, or sewer. There are no on-site bathrooms or showers - your RV must be self-contained.

The good news is that it is free. They do want you to register on arrival, however.

The area is walking distance to the lodge. Our car show/swap meet area is on the West side, so a little more walking to reach that.

If you don't want to dry camp, the "Wandering

Spirit" RV park is just 2 miles West of the Casino, on Hwy 18. It is a clean, nicely landscaped park with both back in and pull through sites. They have over 100 spaces with full hook-ups and 24 hour restrooms and showers. As of this writing, rates are \$50.00 with a 10% discount for Good Sam or AAA members.

They do run a shuttle bus to Spirit Mountain Casino. Reservations at 503-879-5700.

Our Sunday event is the ride on the Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad, leaving Garibaldi, OR.

If you elect to spend some additional time on the Oregon Coast, there are many RV parks along Hwy 101. Search <campgrounds.rvlife.com> for access to these parks. Space availability should be good since we are after the Labor Day weekend.

#### **SWAP MEET**

The Swap Meet will be on the same lot as our Car Show, allowing easy access and plenty of foot traffic.

The lot is known as the Red Lot (see the diagram on Page 5) and the swap spaces will be on the south side, next to a grassy divider. There are 18 spaces, and they are full 10' X 20' with a little bonus space in the grass.

If pre-registration indicates the need for more spaces, we can also use the west side of the Red lot. 12 additional spaces are available

The Swap Meet will be open:

Friday Sept. 9th: 12:00PM - 5:00PM Saturday Sept. 10th: 7:00AM - 5:00PM

Both will be located in a tent in the Red parking lot.



#### **People's Choice Judging**

Why People's Choice? The Northwest Chapter has decided, based on our prior hosting experiences, that People's Choice Judging is our preferred way to judge the vehicles at the shows that we host. This is because the Northwest Chapter found in its experience that formal judging to establish trophy winners at a car show can be difficult for a number of reasons. In particular, the club found that it was difficult to find enough qualified judges and then it seemed unfair to require those judges to spend the entire car show busy judging, with no time to relax and enjoy the cars. Plus, formal judging requires the car owners to be with their car when it is judged, which also restricts the time of the car owners at the show. The club also noticed that fewer people were entering their cars for judging and more car show attendees wanted their vehicles to be for display only.

As a result of all the above considerations and because we want the zone meet to be enjoyable for all participants, we are doing "People's Choice Judging," which was a big hit at the last zone meet we hosted in 2015.

**How does it work?** Under People's Choice Judging, every registered zone meet participant will receive a ballot to select their favorite car in each category. (For example, if you registered a family of 2, you will receive 2 voting ballots.) All of the cars on the show field will be candidates for judging. The ballots will be tallied after the car show and awards for each category (listed below) will be presented at the awards dinner banquet on Saturday night. (The awards banquet is a ticketed event for which you need to pay an entry fee in advance – at the time of registration, which includes dinner.) Our hope is that this type of judging will make the car show much more enjoyable for everyone!

Car Show Time & Location. The car show is on Saturday, September 11, 2022 from 10:00 to 2:00pm. However, all car show participants need to start lining their cars up for a photo of their car by 9:00am. Photos will be taken of the cars and drivers as the cars are entering the car show area. After having the car's photo taken, the cars will then proceed to the car show area, where one of our volunteers will direct the cars and trucks where to park based on their category. The car show will take place in the Red parking lot located behind the Spirit Mountain Casino. There will be signs and volunteers indicating where to go once in the area. Have your car parked by no later than 11:00am for People's Choice Judging.

**2022 Pacific Can-Am Zone Meet People's Choice Judging Categories.** Please note: People's Choice Judging is not formal 400-point judging. Instead, the attendees will mark their ballots with the identifying number of the car they like best in each category. The voters should use whatever judging standards they think are appropriate.

#### **Ballot Categories.**

First, second, and third place awards will be given based on the highest number of ballot votes received from the people in the following categories:

- 1. Pre-war, 1904-1946;
- 2. Post-war, All non- C&K Sedans & Wagons, 1947-1958;
- 3. C&K Coupes & Hardtops, 1953-1961;
- 4. Lark-type, 1959-1966;
- 5. GT Hawks, 1962-1964;
- 6. Avanti Studebaker;
- 7. Avanti All others;
- 8. Trucks, 1902-1964;
- 9. Non-stock, Studebaker-powered; and
- 10. Non-stock, Not Studebaker-powered.

#### **Non-ballot Categories.**

The Northwest Chapter will select the winners for the following awards:

- 1. Longest distance driven in a Studebaker, Canada;
- 2. Longest distance driven in a Studebaker, US; and
- 3. Hard Luck Trophy.
- 4. Best Of Show Award

#### Wine Tasting Tour.

There is a wine tasting loop that starts traveling East from the hotel. On Hwy 22 you will find Chateau Bianca Winery, Benedetto Vineyards, Eola Hills Wine Cellars. Taking a short jaunt you can include Legacy Estate Vineyard on Oak Grove Rd. Finding your way to Hwy 221 your next stop will be Denison Cellars, Audeant Wines and Tastings. Going West on Hwy 153 and turning on Eola Hills Rd., you will find Varnum Vintners and Grochau Cellars. Set your GPS and let it guide you through some scenic route or return to Hwy 153 and find Coelho Winery. You can explore some of the area on your way back to Grand Ronde and find the Coleman Vinyard, J Wrigley Vineyards, Roshambo Artfarm Art + Science (might be closed) and Ransom Wine Company and Distillery tucked away in the hills on your way back to the motel.

#### Pacific City

Visit the ocean town of Pacific City 27 miles from the hotel. This peaceful little coastal town has a 200 foot sand dune to climb and a unique breakwater that offers surfers and anglers rich rewards. This is home to Cape Kiwanda and Haystack Rock. Pacific City's beach provides fishermen with the safest route out to sea. Using special shallow-draft boats called dories, they launch straight into the surf; on the way back in, they sound a loud horn and surf right back onto the beach. You can charter a day of fishing with one of these dories or grab a seat at the Pelican Pub and brewery and enjoy fine food and unique brews brewed on site and watch the beach from their "on the sand deck" or sheltered inside in a very nice restaurant.

#### Casino Tour

You will not have to travel far to enjoy Casino activity since your hotel is part of the Spirit Mountain Casino. Spirit Mountain is operated by the Confederated Tribes of Grand Ronde and according to their claims this is the largest of the 9 Indian Casinos in Oregon. There is also a Casino in Lincoln City called Chinook Winds. That Casino is 24 miles from the Meet hotel.



#### Golfing Opportunities

There are several Golf courses of note in the area and on the Oregon Coast. There are 14 golf courses within 30 miles of the host hotel. Several of these like the Neskowin Beach Golf Course and Westin Salishan Golf Links are located right on the beach. Salishan is modeled after Scottish Links.

#### Tillamook Creamery and Tillamook Smoker

One of the largest visitors attractions on the Oregon Coast is the Tillamook Creamery in Tillamook OR 45 Miles from the host hotel and on the way to the Train ride event on Sunday. The creamery has a self guided tour where you can see how the cream and cheese is made. There is a sampling area for the different kinds of cheese. There is a large gift store and place you can buy all of the cheeses. Of course you will not want to miss buying some of the best ice cream cones in the world. Just up the road is the Tillamook Smoker with great selections of smoked items that will be worth the stop as well.

#### Museums

Evergreen Air & Space Museum, located in McMinnville on Hwy. 18 is home of the one-of-a-kind Spruce Goose, plus many other aviation displays.

Tillamook Air Museum is located just off Hwy. 101, south of Tillamook. It is housed in one of the two World War 2 Blimp Hangars. It looks big from the highway, but walk inside, it looks bigger on the inside.

#### Shopping

Woodburn Outlet Mall, off of I-5 in Woodburn has easy access and many, many brand name stores. Depending on your route to the meet, might be too good to pass by and not take a look. From the Hotel you can travel 26 miles to the Lincoln City Outlet mall for a nice smaller mall with even an axe throwing area for entertainment.

#### THE NORTHWEST CHAPTER DEDICATES THIS SDC ZONE MEET IN HONOR OF ITS FOUNDER, RODGER DELMAR EDDY 1929-2022

A native Portlander and great-grandson of Oregon Trail pioneers, Rodger Delmar Eddy died on January 20, 2022 at the age of 92.

Firstborn son of Delmar and Suzanne Eddy, Rodger was born in Portland on December 22, 1929 during the Great Depression, grew up on 52nd and Oregon Street, and his family's first car was a brand-new light blue 1937 Studebaker chosen for its independent front suspension but lacking a radio and heater.

Then came Pearl Harbor and gas rationing through childhood, and another new car, a shiny green 12-cylinder Lincoln coupe in 1946 when he would have been attending what he called 'Grant High, the best high school in the U.S.', where he graduated in 1948. The old family Studebaker became Rodger's first car which he drove to his classes at Vanport College in Portland that was to become Portland State. He transferred to Eugene and graduated from the University of Oregon's Journalism school in 1952. It's hard to tell his life story without talking about cars.

Rodger met his beautiful wife Janet Christine Godey in 1957 at a Servitus Dance for singles in downtown Portland when he asked her to dance during the last half of the last dance. Janet had been talked into driving her roommate to the dance in her Nash Rambler and was reluctant to go, but for her it was love at first sight, and their song was "Save the Last Dance for Me." They were married in a New York City elopement in 1959 and had three daughters and a son, Cecily Eddy Spencer, Melanie Eddy Robinson, Angela Eddy Sandino, and Rodger Lee Eddy, 14 grandchildren and one great-grandson. Baby son of his son, Natthan 'Hawk' Eddy preceded him in death in 2018, the rest survive him.

His first journalism job as photographer, writer, sports editor and later advertising manager for the Gresham Outlook weekly newspaper began with his first assignment there to track down a two headed frog. Rodger was notorious for driving his futuristic 1936 gray purple Cord Phaeton with white top that he purchased in L.A. in 1951, and what he called 'my stubborn penchant for driving old cars' remained all his life.

As an investigative journalist, he wrote a complex piece on alleged fluoride poisoning of cattle

and flower bulb farms from Reynolds Metals in Troutdale, and a piece that caused a libel suit that the Outlook won and resulted in the law that liberalized free protected speech for newspapers. He went on to manage the Sandy Post and Parkrose Enterprise before launching his own publication, the North Willamette News in Aurora in 1964.

In the summer of 1968, Rodger was the instigator of a meeting of Studebaker owners at Silver Falls that developed into the Charter Meeting of the Studebaker Drivers Club, Northwest Chapter. He served as Chapter President in the early years and was an avid promoter of club activities for the next 54 years. In 1993, when the Northwest Chapter hosted the Studebaker Drivers Club International Meet, he organized and led a 10-day driving tour of the Oregon Trail from Independence Missouri to Portland. The tour participants, mostly driving Studebaker cars and trucks, numbered almost 50 in some segments along the route.

Baptized as an infant in the Episcopal Church, Rodger died peacefully surrounded by his family at home as they sang 'Swing Low, Sweet Chariot', a poetic full circle to his love for earthly chariots, demonstrating to all present how the final foe, death, is overcome by the goodness and grace of God and faith in Jesus Christ, which Rodger professed. Right after his soul's departure, three family members photographed the exquisitely beautiful sunset outside.

Rodger wore ties and pegged pants all the way through the 1970s, was an unswerving optimist, a genius at writing, formal, kind, funny, smart, hard-working, a true egalitarian, faithful to his wife, eccentric, patriotic, whole-hearted, talked to his children like they were grown-ups, adored jazz, he believed in life, in people, in parades, in free speech, in America.

Rodger was buried with a Christian ceremony at the Aurora Community Cemetery next to his parents.

There will be a driver's meeting in the parking lot by the car show area at 9:30am for all the drivers caravanning to the Garibaldi train. The group will depart at 9:45am sharp. **MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A FULL TANK**OF FUEL. The train station is about 75 miles from Spirit Mountain Casino. The one-way drive to Garibaldi from Spirit Mountain will take around 1 hour and 45 minutes.

When we arrive in Garibaldi (about 11:30am), we should have approximately 30 minutes before the train ride starts to stretch our legs. If you want, you can get something to eat across the street from the train station; there is a bakery and a Dairy Queen. (No food is offered on the train.) But, mind your time -- you need to be ready to ride the train by 12:00pm. The train station has restrooms (porta-potties). There is also plenty of secure parking available next to the train station.

The train will depart Garibaldi at 12:00pm. The train ride to Rockaway Beach lasts 30 minutes. From Rockway Beach, you can choose to come back on the train at 1:00 pm or spend some extra time in Rockaway Beach and return to Garibaldi on either the 3:00pm or 5:00pm train. When the train ride is over it is your choice to return home, go back to the casino, or stay a few nights on the Oregon coast. We hope you enjoy the 2022 Pacific Can-Am Zone Meet!
